
- Pain and sudden vision loss in OS for the past 2 days. Was referred by the Glaucoma division after Intravitreal Injection of dexamethasone, vancomycin and ceftazidime.
- POHx: Advanced glaucoma.
 - Trabeculectomy OU (2016).
 - Pseudophakic OD.
- PMHx: Systemic arterial hypertension.

VA OD: 0,1

OS: LP


Slit lamp exam OD: Avascular elevated bleb, no seidel, clear cornea, normal depth anterior chamber with no cells, pseudophakic

Slit lamp exam OS: Conjunctival hyperemia with ciliary injection, avascular elevated bleb, with white purulent content, corneal edema, normal depth anterior chamber, hypopyon, pupillary membrane, cataract








14th Post-Op


No pain. Reports improvement of VA.
